Just like democracy, this is precious and fragile. As an independent cooperative we have struggled to retain staff, and relied heavily on volunteers. For most of those 85 years, its continuation has been precarious. There is no parent organization. Members sustain this unique community to nurture its values and spirit for ourselves and new generations.

Our institutional history resides in us as individuals. Few living people have experienced all 85 of those years. CPC's continuation, its ability to thrive and change to meet future opportunities and challenges depends on us. Retaining and learning from its history, and being its living memory and future requires commitment and action from each of us. Our participation in leadership programs, financial support, growing membership, capturing our story and continuing to foster youth and adult leadership is critical to securing CPC's future.

A recent example is the resurrection of Winter Camp by one of our young staff and interested youth. After its absence for 20 + years, they rebuilt a program that, in unique CPC style, challenges our young folks to step up to leadership. At Winter Camp our young folks take responsibility to create and run their own program including all the practical parts. At that Winter Camp, our young leaders initiated the CPC Legacy Project, through which CPC youth interview elders to capture, preserve and learn from our history.
