What should we know about you? Why do you want to be on the CPC Board? What do you view its role is?

What would you do to foster diversity, equity and inclusion at CPC?

I believe it is crucial to enable people of all walks of life to experience CPC events firsthand to strengthen their interest and commitment to our mission. In the spirit of offering my time and service to CPC, I would strongly recommend we look first within our own community to discuss and assess why there may be inconsistencies between our stated values and the reality of our member population. Transparent, meaningful communication handled with both compassion and respect are crucial to help identify areas that need improvement, determine where we are already successful, and create and execute plans to strengthen the diversity of our membership. Given we have many members in the Chicagoland area, along with folks in the Grand Rapids and surrounding areas of CPC, we should also consider "satellite" locations, Zoom events and workshops, and other non-traditional approaches which will aid in fostering outreach and inclusion.
