I spent at least 6 months this year working on and preparing for our ACA (American Camp Association) accreditation. This required a monumental amount of work with both our administrative filing systems, policy documentation and regulation compliance verification. We also assisted the Summer Camp directors with hiring and gave guidance throughout the spring and summer.

We have grown our connections with Waldorf and Montessori schools to do school retreats and field trips during the week days.
